Sums and differences of multiples of 10 up to 100

This is about knowing all the pairs of numbers that can be added together to make 100, e.g.

$$63 + 37 = 100$$

$$25 + 75 = 100$$

This is really useful when you need to work out change from £1.

You could:

Ask: What must you add to 62p to make £1?

Ask: I cut 35 cm off a 1m long piece of string. How much is left?
