## Term Time Leave:

Changes in the law mean that the Head Teacher no longer has discretion to allow pupils to take term time leave. If you take your child out of school for any reason you will receive a fine for £60 per child per parent. This means that the mum will be fined £60 for each child and the dad will be fined £60 for each child.

### Chicken pox

There has been a bit of confusion about how long children should stay off school when they have chicken pox. This is the advice from the NHS:

#### What to do

To prevent spreading the infection, keep children off nursery or school until all their spots have crusted over. Chickenpox is infectious from one to two days before the rash starts, until all the blisters have crusted over (usually five to six days after the start of the rash).

So it is not generally necessary to have 2 weeks off school and if your child needs more than 2 weeks off you should bring evidence from your GP.
