

in the classroom?



Read Write Inc (RWInc)

- ▶ Children will be taught all their sounds starting in the order
m, a, s, d, t, l, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, i, h, sh, r, j, v, y, w, th, z, ch, q
u, x, ng, nk
- ▶ They will learn the pure sound and the direction in which the letter should be written.
- ▶ Once they have learnt all set 1 and 2 sounds they will begin to blend and segment (put sounds together to read and write words)
- ▶ Once they have become secure in blending and segmenting they will then move onto the ditty books.

Handwriting the Speed Sounds

- ▶ All children are taught how to hold their pencil correctly using their index finger and thumb.
- ▶ Posture is very important when your child is writing.
- ▶ m,a,s,d,t,l,n,p,g,o,c,k,u,b,f,e,l,h,r,j,v,y,w,x,z

Correct Tri-pod Grip



Learning to blend and segment with the sounds we know...

Assisted blending as soon as the first 5 sounds are learnt!


Moving towards independent blending



Fred Fingers for spelling

*Say the word and pinch on the sounds

Eyes for reading, fingers for spelling!




How do phonics help us to read?

Say "hello" to Fred.

Fred can *only* talk in sounds...

He says "c_a_t." Not cat.

We call this *Fred Talk*.

Why read at home?



Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?

Student "A"
reads **20 minutes**
each day

3600 minutes in
a school year

1,800,000 words



Student "B"
reads **5 minutes**
each day

900 minutes in
a school year

282,000 words



Student "C"
reads **1 minute**
each day

180 minutes in
a school year

8,000 words



Reading stories at home

Read favourite stories over and over again

Read some stories at a higher level than they can read themselves.

Listen to them reading their take home Phonics storybooks.








Practise pronouncing the sounds...

How you can help your child at home

- ▶ Praise a lot - children learn more quickly when they are praised for what they do well, rather than nagged for what they do wrong.
- ▶ Fred talk - dinner, washing up, story time
- ▶ Encourage your child to hold their pencil correctly
- ▶ Read and talk about the story

Parent Reading Project




Research has shown that the more stories adults read to the children, the better the children can read themselves.

- ▶ We would like to recognise the work that parents do with their children by asking everyone to take part in the Reading Project.
- ▶ There are five levels: Copper, bronze, silver, gold and platinum.
- ▶ We will award certificates for each level.
- ▶ All you have to do is read ten books from the list provided in each booklet.
- ▶ Read the book to your child and you or the child can make a comment in the booklet provided.
- ▶ When the booklet is completed, give it to your child's class teacher.
- ▶ You will be invited into school to be presented with your certificate.
