

# Learning in Reception

## What does it look like?



The purpose of this presentation is to introduce you to your child's learning environment. In the previous presentation we looked at the Indoor Learning Environment. In this presentation we will look at Outdoor Learning at Nelson Primary School.





From sliding with friends to reading in cosy dens we know that children thrive in the outdoors across the whole year. The outdoors is a powerful learning environment for young children and provides opportunities where they can develop and apply their existing skills and knowledge across all areas of the curriculum.



Having the opportunity to explore water on a grand scale is both exciting and challenging for children. Children will use problem solving as they find out about how to move, redirect, capture and transport water.

# Mud Kitchen




In the Mud Kitchen children have the freedom to investigate - to scoop and stir, mix and mould, pour and whisk with such natural materials as soil and mud. Whether its cake making in a pretend kitchen or a wizard's cavern with magical spells and potions, children will have endless ideas to explore in the Mud Kitchen!





Physical development allows children to develop an understanding of their own body and health. Children do this in range of ways including spacial awareness when moving, co-ordination of small and large movements as well as learning how to play co-operatively and form positive relationships with adults and children.



Constructing with recycled materials allows children to develop their self-confidence as they explore materials and how to use them. They develop their problem-solving skills and resilience as they build their junk models and use trial and error to make their model stand upright or fix materials together successfully.
