Black History Month Facts:

- In the USA, Black History Month is celebrated in February because this was the birthday month of President Abraham Lincoln and also Frederick Douglass, both of whom are very important people in black history.
- Barack Obama was America's first black president.
- The Quakers (a religious society) first protested against slavery in 1688. Britain banned slavery in 1833 and Mauritania in Africa was the last country to ban slavery in 1981.
- Unlike what the movies show, 1 in 4 cowboys were black.
- Hattie McDaniel was the first black woman to win an Oscar (in 1940) but she wasn't even allowed to go to the film premiere of her film, *Gone with the Wind*, because she was black.
- British black comedian Lenny Henry was a huge influence in promoting comedy by black comedians – something that was unheard of before him.
- In 2015, Lewis Hamilton, a British black Formula One driver, became the most successful British F1 driver in history.
