Nursery Trip to Central Park

Nursery made telescopes this week and used them during our visit to Central Park to spot all the things that they could see. We found squirrels, buzzy bees and even some beetles in amongst the wildflower patch. We did some pond dipping and discovered lots of water boatmans and damselflies. The children had a wonderful time despite the very hot weather.

Year 1 have been learning about people who work in the emergency services. They took part in a workshop on lifeboats and learnt about water safety. They also solved problems as police officers, finding missing pens and class resources using clues.

As part of the year 5 work week, M2 and M3 went to visit Here East, the main technology centre in East London. We were met by representatives of several companies trading from the site, and they explained to us the different technology that their companies use. They also explained that the site housed approximately 5000 people, so they had their own on site recycling plant. We went to see part of the recycling plant and learnt that cardboard with any grease on it, such as pizza boxes, need to be put in general waste, rather than cardboard recycling as the grease deposits would render anything near to it contaminated. The children played a recycling game, and told the company representatives about the apps that they had created for work week. After eating our lunch on site, Here East allowed us to use one of their special electric shuttle buses to take us back to Stratford station. An informative and eniovable visit!
