Introduction

We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables pupils to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents/carers. All children must wear their school uniform when attending school.

Aims and objectives

- ✓ To create a sense of community and belonging towards the school.
- ✓ To supports the school's commitment to inclusion.
- ✓ To provide practical and smart appearance with health and safety in mind.
- ✓ To ensure all pupils have equal access to wearing school uniform regardless of their culture, race, religion, gender, disability.

School Uniform

- Plain grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress.
- Plain white shirt or polo shirt (school logo optional)
- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan (school logo optional)
- Plain grey tailored shorts (summer months)
- Navy and white Gingham pattern dress (summer months)
- Leggings or tights worn under skirts or dresses should be grey or navy
- ❖ Black, flat-soled shoes or trainers
- Scarves worn for religious purposes must be navy or white
- School PE t-shirt -
- Navy shorts/jogging bottoms
- Black trainers or plimsolls
- Swimming costume/trunks/wet suits for swimming
- School book bag

Where children are unable to wear the correct uniform (including PE uniform) the school will provide good quality second-hand uniform to support families.

We encourage parents to donate uniform that their children have outgrown that we can then pass on to others.

School Uniform Purchase

Jewellery

Due to health and safety reasons the school enforces a strict jewellery code. The only items of jewellery that can be worn are small studs and a watch.

Pupils are required to remove any item of jewellery worn during P.E. lessons to prevent them from causing injury to themselves and others.

Pupils are not permitted to wear make-up to school, including nail varnish.
